



**Assistant/Associate Professor – Tenure Track – Medical Laboratory Sciences

**Position Description**

The nationally accredited Program in Medical Laboratory Science (MLS) at Saint Louis University invites applications for a full-time, tenure track faculty member to join an established and well-respected program. This program is located in the Clinical Health Sciences Department in the Doisy College of Health Sciences and is composed of dynamic, collegial, and multi-disciplinary faculty and staff. The tenure track, 9-month appointment has an anticipated start date of August 19, 2019. Primary responsibilities include: (i) undergraduate teaching in the MLS and Investigative and Medical Science degree programs with opportunities for administrative oversight of NAACLS accreditation; (ii)



research and scholarly activities aligned with promotion on the tenure track; and (iii) participation in Department, College and/or University service as well as professional development activities. A competitive total compensation package, including applicable start-up funds, tuition remission for qualified personnel, and a generous retirement plan will be provided. Rank and salary are dependent on qualifications and experience.

- o Experience in grant submissions and/or funding
